Located in the Anacostia Arts Center, the Fresh Food Factory (FFF) Market is a retail incubator market that serves Ward 8 as a catalyst for food equity and economic development. FFF Market's mission is to improve the health of underserved residents through enhanced food access and education, and the wealth of under-capitalized business owners. FFF Market is owned by Amanda Stephenson, a resident of Ward 8.

Market 7, a community marketplace featuring Black owned businesses, will operate the new 7,000 sq ft food hall at Benning Market. It will include a community grocer, several prepared food incubations, and retail installations by local makers. Founded by Mary Blackford, Ward 7 resident, Market 7's mission is to revitalize the economic stability, health, and social needs of Ward 7 residents. Market 7 will provide healthy and sustainable shopping experiences and stimulate the local economy by supporting emerging small businesses & urban farmers.

Good Food Markets (GFM) is a social enterprise of DC-based nonprofit Oasis Community Partners (Oasis). Together, GFM and Oasis are working to improve food access and community health. GFM is a small-format grocery serving fresh produce, groceries and fresh prepared food in low income neighborhoods that do not have access to a grocery store. GFM is run by Philip Sambol, a resident of Ward 5.

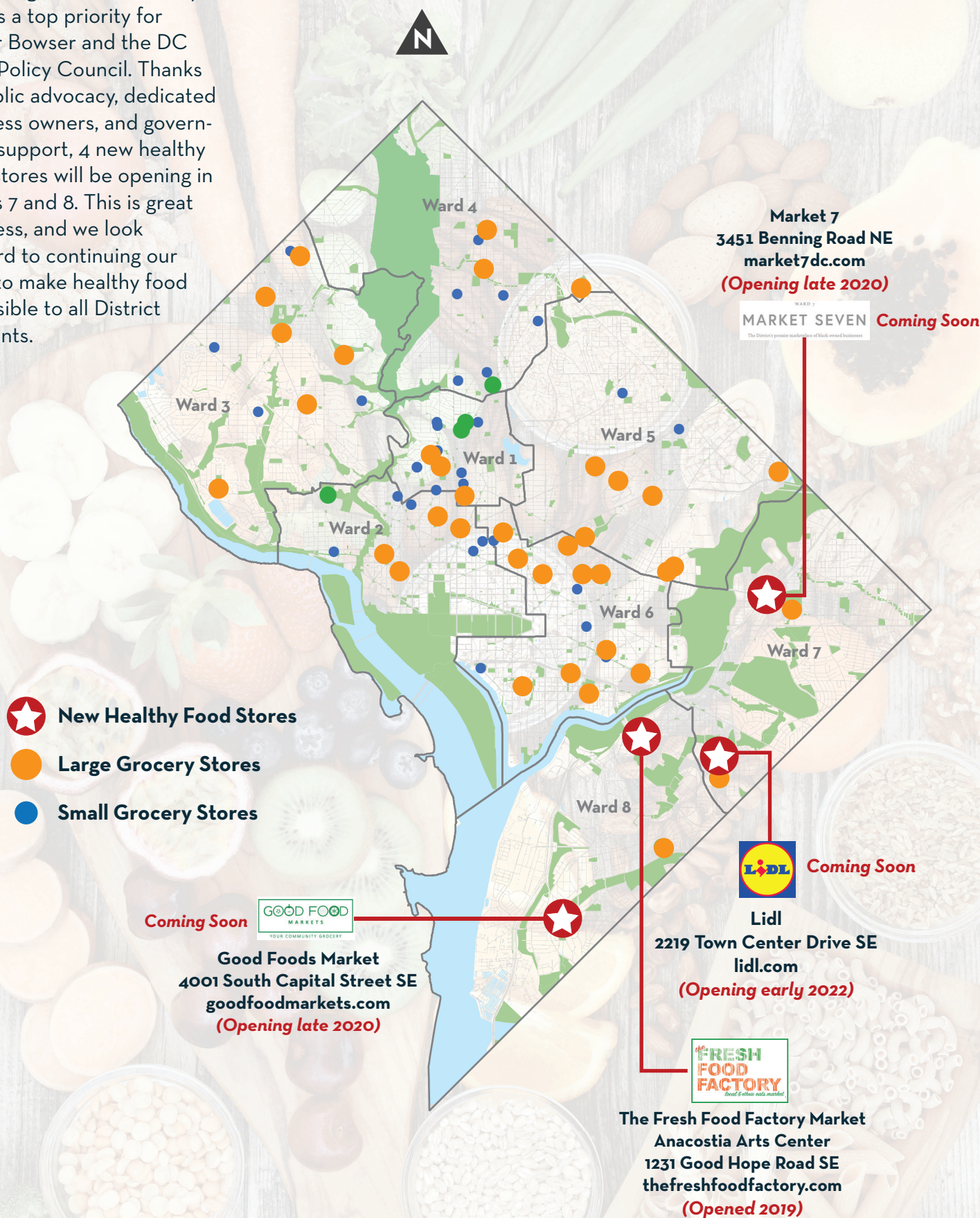
